Week 4 of Short+Sweet Theatre – thrills and spills!

The biggest little theatre festival in the world, Short+Sweet, continues from Wed Jan 27 with the fourth week of the festival's selection of over 150 tasty, ten-minute bites.

> A conversation about a screenplay pitch between a husband and wife that turns sinister, a bizarre robbery by a shopkeeper's dad and an unlikely friendship between an angst-ridden teen and a war veteran are just a few of this week's offerings at the Depot Theatre in Marrickville.

Kel Vance's beautiful play *The Shoebox* (right) portrays an unlikely friendship forming between an angst-ridden tween and a wheelchair-bound war vet over the contents of a mysterious shoebox. The writer directs 14yo Ashlyn Hunter, Saban Lloyd Berrell and Charlotte Hanson in this miraculous feel-good drama – with a twist!

In Peter Cox and Norah George's thriller, *The Pitch* (*below left*), a lawyer wife reads her writer husband's new screenplay pitch – with alarming implications. Has



he poisoned her wine as his character does in the story? Amelia Morris directs Myles Waddell & Amanda Mikhael.

Rivers Robbery (pictured centre below), written by and starring Chris Heaslip and Davey Reynolds, is a hilarious comedy about a salesperson being robbed by... his dad – out for thrills and reclaiming his youth!

We move to a beautician's salon as the setting for *It Hurts More When You Talk (below)*, written and directed by Lisa Kelaher. A beautician (Leanne Mangan) is annoying, not pleasantly distracting Wendy (Sandy Sharma) when she talks... and talks... and talks while giving her a 'Brazilian'.

Susan Corby's *Burn Out* follows a committed young social worker in her journey from idealism and courage to despair and hopelessness. Brett Joachim directs Alexandra Joyce, Megan Mapp, Matthew Popp and Laura O'Neill.

Finally, *The Perfect Independent Film* (below right) is Trace Crawford's hilarious piece about two co-workers dogged by the attentions of wacky screenwriters, determined to turn their mundane existence into art... Julie Zimmerman directs Sarah North, Lucy Smith, Jim McInnes and Tony Guyot.

Plus an extra whole program in the Wildcards section (Sat 2.30pm and Sunday 1pm) including Thomas Coash's *Kamasutra*.

Meanwhile in Newtown, *Short+Sweet Cabaret* reaches its final week Wed-Sat at the New Theatre before it's Slide Bar Final (including Comedy+Magic) on Sunday 7 Feb.

Short+Sweet Theatre plays at the Depot Theatre Wed-Sun through to February with both a Top 80 (Wed-Sat 7.30pm plus Sun 5.30) and separate Wildcards (Sat 2.30 and Sun 1pm) program. 
